Board Member Ethics

The Board of Education of District 204 is guided by the following code of ethics that was adopted by the Board of the National Association of School Boards on October 9, 1975:

"As a member of my local Board of Education, I will strive to improve public education, and to that end I will:

"Attend all regularly scheduled Board meetings insofar as possible and become informed concerning the issues to be considered at those meetings;

"Endeavor to make policy decisions only after full discussion at publicly held Board meetings;

"Render all decisions based on the available facts and my independent judgement, and refuse to surrender that judgement to individuals or special interest groups;

"Encourage the free expression of opinion by all Board members, seek systematic communications between the Board and students, staff, and all elements of the community;

"Work with other Board members to establish effective Board policies and to delegate authority for the administration of the schools to the Superintendent;

"Communicate to other Board members and the Superintendent expressions of public reaction to Board policies and school programs;

"Inform myself about current educational issues through individual study and participation in programs providing needed information, such as those sponsored by my state and national School Boards' associations;

"Support the employment of those persons best qualified to serve as school staff, and insist on a regular and impartial evaluation of all staff;

"Avoid being placed in a position of conflict of interest, and refrain from using my Board position for personal or partisan gain;

"Take no private action that will compromise the Board or administration, and respect the confidentiality of information that is privileged under applicable law; and

"Remember always that my first and greatest concern must be the educational welfare of the students attending the public schools."
